J.P. Morgan said, "Millionaires don't need astrologers, but billionaires do".

January 2024 begins a very good quarter. The stock market should continue to do well. New businesses that begin in this first quarter of 2024 should do well. And any new projects you initiate should do well. Planets will all be direct after RX Uranus turns direct on January 26, 2024. The next RX Mercury isn't until April 1 through April 25. This quarter, plan to begin something you always wanted to try.

The U.S. and global economies should continue to do well, with inflation coming down to the U.S. Federal Reserve's desired 2%. Inflation is now down to 3.9%. The Fed is expected to make its first cut to interest rates in March. Gas and oil prices should also stay down.

The **magic formula for stocks that go over \$1000 a share, such as Priceline (Bookings Holdings), Chipotle, and most of the Magnificent Seven, is a combination of Sun/Jupiter/Pluto.** The next dates that this occurs will be **January 22-23, 2024.** Check new IPOs and stocks that begin trading at or around that time. Q&A:

Please explain STOP and GO on the calendar. The **STOP** time means stop pushing ahead in sales and promoting business activities if you want to succeed. Stop means rest, relax, file papers, take a walk, do your laundry, meditate, make social calls, visit with friends, etc. **GO** means return to business activities, making sales calls, negotiating contracts, and arranging and scheduling appointments.




Why are the STOP and GO periods called Void-of-Course? This is a period of time every 2½ days when the Moon no longer forms major aspects with other planets in the solar system until it enters the next zodiac sign. When you see a business or a new store open and close within three months, it most likely signed its contracts in a Void-of-Course period. No company on the stock exchange has a V/C Moon.

How exact do I need to be? When signing a contract, do I have leeway to sign, or must it be exact? It would be best if you were exact (to the minute). Sometimes, there is a "window," but most signing times quickly change from extraordinary to okay to not-so-good.

Do I use the city nearest my location as my choice for the date and time to sign? Yes, the nearest large city within 200 miles of your location.
